## The Speakers



**Dennis Blejer** is an engineering physicist by profession. He has been employed by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Lincoln Laboratory since 1985, where he is engaged in studies on electromagnetic scattering and phenomenology, radar systems design, and signal processing. He

is also the branch leader for the School of Practical Philosophy and Meditation in Boston, and has been a member of the School for 35 years. His interest in consciousness studies comes from his practice of meditation and study of the philosophy of mind. He holds a Bachelor Degree in Physics from Brandeis University, and was on the research staff at Harvard University, Department of Engineering and Applied Physics, where he also did graduate studies in applied physics and mathematics.



**Graham Dunstan Martin** lectured in French literature, language and philosophy at Edinburgh University between 1965 and 2000. He has published two children's novels; four adult science-fiction / fantasy novels; a number of translations of French poetry including the Penguin Laforgue; three

works of literary philosophy; and three works of anti-materialist philosophy, namely *Shadows in the Cave* (Penguin 1990), *Does It Matter?* (Floris 2005) and *Living On Purpose* (Floris 2008), books which seek to show that, properly understood, science does not support a materialist / physicalist view of the universe, that it leaves room for spiritual realities, an afterlife, and the ultimate knowledge of the mystics.



**Dr. Elisabet Sahtouris** is an internationally known American/Greek evolution biologist now living on Mallorca. She has taught at the Univ.

of Massachusetts and MIT, was a UN consultant on indigenous peoples, is a member of the World Wisdom Council and organized the first Evolution of Science Symposium in Hokkaido, Japan, with a second symposium to be held in Kuala Lumpur this year. She presents to businesses, banks, governments, progressive business alliances and other international organizations on the maturation of humanity from competition to cooperation, as well as on what we can learn from nature to live better on a hotter planet. Her books include *EarthDance: Living Systems in Evolution*, *A Walk Through Time: from Stardust to Us* and *Biology Revisited* (with Willis Harman).
